

PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION/ PUBLIC POLICY, MPA/MPP

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Introduction

The fields of public administration and public policy may intersect and complement one another. This dual-degree program provides students with the opportunity to focus on public policy issues while learning administrative skills necessary for success in variety of public service settings. The total number of credit hours required to earn both degrees through this program is only 16 more than the total number of credit hours required for the Master of Public Administration (<https://catalog.ucdenver.edu/cu-denver/graduate/schools-colleges-departments/school-public-affairs/public-affairs/public-administration-mpa/>) or the Master of Public Policy (<https://catalog.ucdenver.edu/cu-denver/graduate/schools-colleges-departments/school-public-affairs/public-affairs/public-policy-mpp/>) by itself.

Admission

Students interested in pursuing the dual-degree program must apply to and be admitted to each of the programs. Students admitted to one program may choose to apply to the other program at a later date. Program Delivery

- Courses are offered on campus, online, and in remote and hybrid formats.

Program Requirements

1. Students are required to take 16 courses, or 48 semester hours, to complete the dual degree.
2. Students without pre-service experience in the government or nonprofit sectors will also be required to take a three-credit internship course, bringing the total number of semester hours to 51.
3. Students must earn a minimum of B- grade in each required course applied to satisfy degree requirements and must maintain a 3.0 cumulative GPA.
4. No more than six semester hours of Independent Study may be applied towards the degree.

³ PUAD 5750 is a 1-credit course that must be taken three times with different topics each time.

⁴ If an MPA/MPP student is required to take PUAD 6910 Internship, the program will require 51 credits for completion.
