Introduction

Writing professionals across many fields are increasingly expected to know how to use AI in a rapidly changing environment. The Writing and Editing with AI certificate program addresses this need by equipping students with essential AI literacy skills, enabling them to thrive in environments where AI integration is becoming the norm. The Writing and Editing with AI certificate program is an opportunity for students to design their own tracks of formal study at the intersections of writing and AI and to gain hands-on experience writing with AI (through internships and experiential/client-partnered courses).

Certificate Requirements

- 1. Students must complete a minimum of 12 credit hours to earn this certificate
- Students must complete a minimum of <u>six upper-</u> division (3000- level or higher) credit hours.
- 3. Students must complete a minimum of 6 ENGL credit hours.
- 4. Students must earn a minimum grade of C- (1.7) in all courses that apply to the certificate and must achieve a minimum cumulative certificate GPA of 3.0 GPA. Courses taken using P+/P/F or S/U grading cannot apply to certificate requirements.
- All credits for the certificate must be completed with CU Denver faculty.

Certificate Restrictions, Allowances and Recommendations

 Students must complete two foundational courses, and either two electives in their focus area or one elective and one experiential learning opportunity in their focus area
